The Network of Junior Researchers in Intelligence History (NJRIH) and the International Intelligence History Association (IIHA) call for submissions to the Young Researchers Forum at the 2016 IIHA Annual Conference.

The NJRIH provides a forum for young scholars working in the field of intelligence studies to discuss their work with their peers as well as established scholars and researchers in the field.

The annual conference of the IIHA will take part at the "Militärhistorisches Museum" in Dresden, Germany, from April 15 to 17, 2016. The main topic of the conference is military intelligence.

As part of this conference, the Young Researchers Forum offers young scholars in the field of intelligence studies a place to present their current research – such as master theses or dissertations. Participants are welcome to present their work in progress, give an overview of their project, discuss case studies with the group, or focus on methodological or theoretical questions. There is no topical restriction, so works on any type of intelligence will be accepted. We welcome contributions from different disciplines such as history, political science, cultural studies and science.

In order to leave time for lively discussions, presentations are expected to be 10-15 minutes.

Submission and deadline

We would like to invite you to submit an abstract of 150-200 words by February 20, 2016. Your proposal should include a brief CV stating your academic background, your university affiliation, your research interests, and the current status of your project. We especially encourage young researchers who have little or no conference experience to participate and present their current research.

There will be a limited amount of grants for participants in the Forum. If you have need of financial support, please indicate it with your submission.
